WeGo temporarily suspends bus service until 6 a.m. due to road conditions Access, Star still operating with caution

NASHVILLE – Due to weather overnight, local bus service within Davidson County on Tuesday, February 16, 2021 will be <u>temporarily suspended until 6:00 a.m.</u> while Operations Supervisors assess road conditions for bus maneuverability and customer safety.

Access services are still operating medical trips only as of the time of this release, but drivers are proceeding with caution and customers should expect delays.

The WeGo Star is still operating but at the time of this release, as is the 93 Star West End Shuttle. Customers should prepare for delays and allow for additional travel time due to weather and road conditions between downtown and Vanderbilt.

Safety is our number one priority, so please be aware that there may be additional delays as bus operators are proceeding cautiously. We ask that you allow for additional travel time so we can help get you where you need to go safely.
